

Dear Shareholders,

We are so proud of the success and direction of our organization. We are happy to share our results with you for the fiscal year 2022. Our growth and financial position are important to our organization, but we are most proud of the hours of care we provided and the number of clients served. These figures are the true impact of our work, real people and families receiving help from the programs and services we provide.

Webster says the definition of Impact is the striking of one thing against another, it can also be described as a force exerted by a new idea, concept, technology, or ideology. Impact is also an impinging which means something influenced or made an impression. This year's impact report will share stories and figures that speak to each of these definitions.

The benefits of our programs striking against another can be illustrated by the foster care department's 87 permanencies. This means our foster care team worked with foster children, biological families and foster families to successfully secure 87 safe and secure forever homes for children who had been in the foster care system.

An impinging is clear in the story about a client who recently lost over 100 pounds while living in one of our therapeutic residential homes! The staff at Schippel House recognized a client's need to get healthy so they set a goal and created a plan to get there. Darius's success has made a positive impression on everyone as the weight loss journey was a total group effort by our staff.

One of our biggest impacts to date, which illustrates the force of a new idea, concept or technology, will be happening soon as we break ground on our new therapeutic residential campus in Hoyleton! Our new ultramodern facility is designed specifically for trauma recovery. This project was just a dream for decades but because of your continued support and the commitment to our mission the dream will soon be a reality.

Our impact cannot be achieved without the challenging work, generous donations and ongoing support of our donors, volunteers, board members and staff. In our 2022 fiscal year we served over 4,100 clients, provided 10,440 hours of clinical care, delivered 2,256 Christmas gifts to clients, filled 372 backpacks with school supplies and raise over \$36,000 in one evening at our Honors event last May.

Thank you for supporting our mission and for allowing us to continue to be innovative in our efforts to make a positive lasting impact on the children and families we serve.

Successful Partnership Leads to Bigger Impact in the Community



Hoyleton's Puentes de Esperanza program was created in 2004 through the UCC Conference Office to meet the needs of the growing Hispanic population in Southern Illinois. As a result of the UCC's efforts and Hoyleton's capacity to serve the Hispanic community as a new ministry, Puentes de Esperanza was born.

Puentes de Esperanza, which means Bridges of Hope, is regarded as one of the most important partnerships for the Hispanic community in the southern part of the state, especially to those with limited English. Puentes' mission is to transform the lives of children and families through community-based programs and services directed at their physical, emotional, spiritual and social needs.

2004 was perfect timing for Puentes, because that same year Katie Heaton, Assistant Director of the Mississippi Valley Library District, was getting a brand-new library established in Fairmont City which has a high population of Hispanic residents. These two newly formed entities worked together and provided the region with interpretation, immigration, and health services. They also provided educational programs and financial guidance to help immigrants become established in the community. Puentes and the Fairmont City library complimented each other. Puentes provided services and support, while the library location provided a place where local residents could go to get the information, meet with Puentes staff, or ask for help. Kristen Shinn, Hoyleton Director of Community Support Services and Puentes de Esperanza, said "Katie and I are in constant communication. We are always on the same page when it comes to removing barriers for the people we serve." Kristen added, "our missions are very similar so we are always in collaboration on how to help the community. We have identified the same need gaps and find ways to make it work."

The Fairmont City Library and the Puentes Welcome Center have hosted and promoted countless events for Puentes de Esperanza. The more than 18,000 members of the Hispanic community throughout the Southern Illinois region know they can come to the Fairmont City library to be put in touch with someone from Puentes or attend a workshop at the library hosted by Puentes.

Jolie and Kylie are the first recipients of this scholarship.

Client Success Story

This is the quote the staff from Schippel House believes sums up their recent success with a client.

Darius is a 15-year-old non-verbal autistic child who weighed almost 500 pounds when he arrived at Schippel House last August. As a result of a diet and exercise plan he now weighs 384 pounds. Prior to placement at Schippel House Darius spent over two months in the hospital due to environmental and medical neglect. He is what social services considers hard to place because he needed not only emotional and psychological support but physical assistance too.

When the staff at Schippel House, who call themselves the Schippel Squad, learned about their new client Darius last summer, they were unsure if Schippel was the right place for him. They had concerns about his health and situational needs, but after visiting him in the hospital, an immediate connection was made and all doubts were put to rest. The Schippel Squad quickly realized that despite being overweight, Darius was able to move around without issue and his willingness to follow daily routines and complete tasks after the first request was uncommon for an autistic youth.

Darius has done an amazing job working with staff to reach his weight loss goals. He stays active by riding a stationary bike, going on walks, and dancing to songs like 'I like to Move It' from Madagascar. The Schippel Squad keep things fun by playing tag, basketball, and going to the park to swing. They have stated that this has not been an overnight success. We have worked with Darius from day one. We make sure he has healthy food for snacks. Apples are one of Darius's favorite snacks and he now only has one soda a week.

Kisten Swisher, a Youth Care Worker said, "he's gained so much confidence and he's showing signs of being happier with a healthier life! He was so willing and now he's become so able, he's pretty much unstoppable!"

Our Financials

Fiscal Year 2022 results continue to reflect financial strength for Hoyleton Youth and Family Services. Total program revenue of \$20,352,122 remained relatively stable from prior year reflecting only -0.6% change. The stabilization was driven by increased funding to the Residential program and continuation of Covid funding enhancements for Puentes de Esperanza. The losses reflected, and reduction in Agency net assets, is primarily due to investment losses in the market.






Fiscal Year 2022 - \$20,208,537




